

## **Pakistan's export Potential in Indian market: The case of Textiles**

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The trade volumes between India and Pakistan started plummeting after touching the peak of \$ 2 Billion during 2007-8. The trade potential between the two countries has been a subject of analysis and discussion since quite some time. The interest in regional trade flows in South Asia was engendered due to SAPTA and SAFTA and has resulted in the publication of a large number of studies exploring the potential of SAFTA to promote the regional trade. The regional trade in South Asia however continues to be less than 5 %. Many analysts assert that the political tensions between India and Pakistan are responsible for the slow trade integration in South Asia. The commentators on South Asia trade integration could be divided in four categories: enthusiasts [Burki etc.], optimists (Kemal etc.), pessimists (Jayatileke S Bandara and Wusheng Yu etc. ) and realists [Raihan etc.]. In the government circles, since a few years, the State Bank of Pakistan has been putting forth a case for more trade with India, asserting that a 'huge' potential existed for Pakistan in the Indian market once the trade was normalized--- after Pakistan ends with the positive list approach for the importation from India--- between the two countries under SAFTA. State Bank in a Study, published in 2005, predicted that the then trade volume of \$ 900 million between the two countries would go as high as US\$5.2 billion in five years. More recently, many studies using Gravity Model [Sajjad 2009, Naseem 2010, LSE 2011], claim that Pakistan has a big potential in Indian market. The same is the case with some other RCA based studies. [Das 2008]

New optimism regarding trade relations is discernible in Pakistan after the resumption of Trade Talks in April 2011 as a part of the Composite Dialogue.

Though strong sections in Pakistani society want to see the resolution of outstanding political disputes between the two countries [to the satisfaction of Pakistan] before normalizing the trade relations [Daily Nation 20.08.11], there are many more voices which sense a business opportunity in India after the appreciation of Indian rupee and a perception that the production costs in India are going up. The government of Pakistan has also declared the regional trade as one of its priority and the Ministry of Commerce has publicly affirmed that they were willing to grant MFN status to India and would like to move fast to deepen the bilateral trade relations by working with India to reduce NTBs and possibly negotiating a SAFTA plus bilateral arrangement between the two countries.

The change of heart at the Ministry of Commerce is in a marked contrast to the ‘traditional’ approach by a fairly large number of researchers and opinion makers in Pakistan who believe that the success of SAFTA or any other bilateral trade arrangement with India depended more on the improvement of political relations between India and Pakistan and that they did not see it improving in the short term at least, especially when India too produces and exports all that is produced and exported by Pakistan. This thinking has been supported all along by most of the business associations and chambers of commerce and industry who would assert that that India was merely interested in establishing a hub and spoke trade system in South Asia. In a way, the Ministry of Commerce and some potent voices in the business community in Pakistan e.g. FPCCI and OCCI, have internalized the ‘traditional’ Indian position that both the countries should de-connect trade from politics which in case of Pakistan would mean according the MFN status to India.<sup>1</sup>

According to recent Trade and Conflict Linkages studies, India-Pakistan bilateral trade remains very sensitive to political ‘stress’; the last one being the drop in trade volumes which could be correlated to an extent to Mumbai Attack.

This changed perspective is justified on the basis of a presumably ‘huge potential’, which Pakistani exports would have in a fast moving Indian economy with Indian imports standing at around \$ 250 billion in 2010-2011. For some, the export dollars lost due to less trade with India far outweigh the benefits of the ‘traditional approach’ to Indo-Pak relations. Many international organizations and donors also are keen to see trade ties between the two countries opening up fast and have been sponsoring studies and programmes to boost regional trade cooperation.<sup>2</sup> Most of these studies, however, are unable to sufficiently explain the low level of Pakistan’s exports to India despite the fact that the latter has granted MFN status to Pakistan since long. The bilateral trade between the two countries has yet to reach at the level of 2007-8! This calls for a more rigorous analysis before jumping to the conclusion that Pakistan has a huge export potential in India. Usually the blame is put on the presence of NTBs in India and on poor connectivity and trade facilitation arrangements between the two countries. These popular explanations are now tacitly endorsed by the Indian side also and the latter expects that Pakistan should give MFN to India in exchange of a promise to remove the NTBs.<sup>3</sup>

The invitation from Indian Minister of Commerce to his Pakistani counterpart to visit New Delhi towards the end of September 2011 to take the optimism created in April 2011 Talks to a logical conclusion has created further impetus to look at the ‘real opportunities’ Pakistani exporters can have in India. We believe that the presence of NTBs and poor connectivity are important issues to be addressed but there are other factors on the Indian side also which are holding Pakistan’s export

to India. A better understanding of the Indian market would help us identify those factors which could impede any major increase of Pakistan's exports to India. Pakistan trade negotiators can deploy more effective negotiation strategies with a better understanding of these factors for the mutual benefit of the two countries from opening up the bilateral trade.

### **Importance of Textile Sector:**

In this Report, we are looking at the Indian market to assess the export potential of Pakistan's Textiles in the coming years. Most of the work done on the subject in Pakistan is general in nature and there is a relative dearth of research literature on studies at micro (product/firm), and meso (sectoral) levels. After pointing out to the proverbial unavailability of data as their main concern, these studies usually begin and end with the trend analyses of available statistics. We have tried to focus at the sectoral level with a hope that this Report would lead the way to a more sustained interest on the dynamics and evolution of Indian import market.

Textiles exports from Pakistan account for around 56 % of its total exports and Pakistan enjoys Revealed Comparative Advantage in many Textile products in such markets where South Asians compete with each other such as EU and US. [CARIS Report 2010] There is a growing perception in Pakistan that Textile is Pakistan's major hope in Indian import market. Textiles and Leather Products account for about two thirds of Pakistan's total exports. Textile and Leather sectors in Pakistan have striking structural affinities with each other. Therefore, an in-depth study of the export potential of Pakistan Textiles can also be largely relevant for the Leather exports.

Textile sector accounts for more than 70 % of manufactured exports of Pakistan and have multifarious backward linkages. It is the largest employer in the formal manufacturing sector. Pakistan is essentially an agricultural country still. The Textile sector provides the highest value addition for Pakistan's among the

principle cash crops of Pakistan i.e., Wheat, Sugar Cane, Rice and Cotton. If Pakistan's Textile sector would not be able to do well in India, the export base of Pakistan to India would become very small. The trade deficit between the two countries is already in favour of India by a wide margin. If Pakistan's textiles would not be able to do well in India, Pakistan would not be able to justify the opening up of its market to India as any dramatic increase in trade deficit between the two countries could have serious commercial and political ramifications. In the light of the above, we have chosen Textile sector for a more detailed analysis to know about its export potential in Indian market. In the following sections, we give an overview of Indian Textile sector followed by an overview of Pakistan's textile sector. Then we give a brief analysis of bilateral trade in textiles over the last few years as well as the dynamics of intra-industry trade. At the end we have summarized our findings and presented some suggestions.

## **Section I:**

### ***1.1 Indian Textile and Clothing Sector: An Overview***

The Indian Textile and Clothing (T&C) sector is one of the largest and most important sector of the Indian economy. It contributes 4% to GDP, 12.5% to the foreign exchange earnings and more than 35 million to the employment<sup>4</sup>, making it the second largest provider of jobs after agriculture. The sector also creates a large volume of indirect employment, both in traditional (like production of cotton and other natural fibers) as well as in modern industries (like textile design and fashions).

The T&C sector in India has shown a robust growth in recent years until it was jolted by the global financial crisis. During the period of 2004-08, the sector CGAR was 8% and it stood among the best performers of the manufacturing

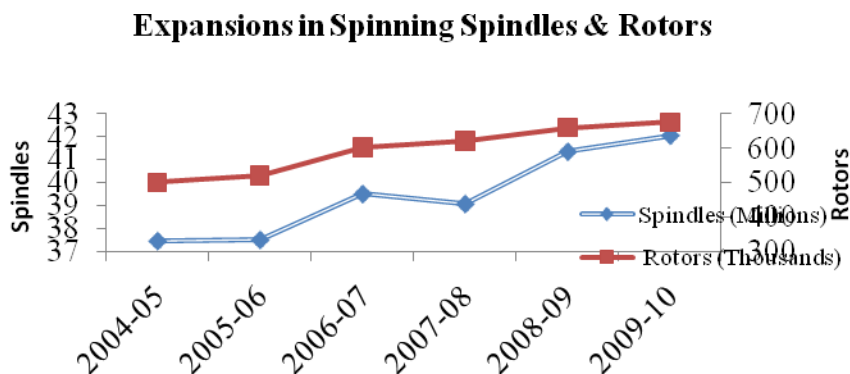

sectors in the country. On external front, the export of the sector was bolstered by the buoyancy in global economic growth, the abolition of MFA (since January 2005), and rapidly growing world trade. Supply side factors such as improving cost competitiveness, expansion of multi-fibre base, rapidly growing production capacity of fibre, yarn and fabrics have also played crucial role in the robust performance of the sector.

**Spinning sector** is by far the most efficient and technically advanced sub-sector of Indian T&C industry, thanks to the deregulations that was started way back in 1980s. It holds a high world ranking in terms of installed capacity. Indian spinning sector is only second and third largest in terms of installed capacity of spindles for cotton and wool processing, respectively (Table No. 1). Installed capacities of both spindles and rotors have been increasing steadily over the years (Table No. 2). Further, As much as 85% of the total yarn production is contributed by the organised mill sector. There is also high presence of (43%) Small Scale Industry (SSI).

The yarn production in India has increased at a moderate average growth rate of nearly 4.5% p.a. since 2005-06 (Table 3). The growth in production of man-made Filament Yarn (MMFY) (5.6%) has been higher than that of spun yarns (4.2%). Despite the higher growth of MMFY, spun yarn dominates the overall production share of yarn at over 73%. Within MMFY, it is the Polyester Filament yarn, which leads the yarn production with a share of around 94%. The yarn sector saw its output contracting by over 3% in 2008-09 in the wake of the global financial crisis. However, the sector experienced a sharp recovery from the crisis by recording a growth of nearly 7% during 2009-10.

The spinning sector enjoys strength from a very strong fibre base in the country. India ranks high in production of all major fibres including jute, cotton, silk, polyester, viscose, acrylic (Table No. 4) The country is the largest producer of Jute fibre in the world. It is only second largest producer of cotton, silk and cellulosic fibres, though it is placed at a long distance from 1<sup>st</sup> Ranker China in these cases. India has been fast catching in man-made textiles.

*India's weaving sector* is dominated by SSI and is the most fragmented sector of the T&C industry. This is evident from the fact that SSI contributes around 80% of total fabrics and shares 95% of total fabrics exports. Decades of restrictive government policies favouring small-scale operations have led to certain structural weaknesses in the sector. This sector is lagging in productivity to supply very high quality of fabrics both to domestic and exports units for garmenting. India ranks first in terms of global ranking of installed capacity of looms, whether it relates to shuttle looms or Handlooms. Only in shuttle less looms the country ranks relatively lower at number 4. The percentage of shuttleless looms to plain looms is hardly 3 per cent compared with the world average of 16 per cent. Low presence of shuttleless looms, which ensure high-quality fabric is a matter of concern for the India. Nevertheless, India may continue to enjoy high ranking in overall size of looms for many years to come as the capacity has been expanding consistently in the sector over the years (Table No. 5).

*Fabrics production* holds the high position in the value chain of T&C sector. The production in the weaving sector has been growing at a rate of over 4% since 2005-06. The largest production of fabric is contributed by the decentralized power looms (61.6%), followed by decentralized hosiery (21.7%), handlooms (12.1%), mills (3.3%) and Khadi, wool, silk sector (1.4%)<sup>5</sup>. In term of yearly average growth, decentralized hosiery sector has grown the fastest (6%) since 2005-06, followed by decentralized power loom sector (3.9%) (Table No. 6).

*The Garment sector* has been the driving force for the growth of Indian T&C sector. India's garment industry is characterised by a large number of independent small-scale firms. Even in exports, scale of operation is much smaller than the internal standards. An average Indian garment exporter has around 119 machines, compared to 698 in Hong Kong and 605 in China.

### ***1.2 Pakistan's Textile and Clothing Sector: An Overview<sup>6</sup>***

Textile and Clothing sector in case of Pakistan is one of the most important manufacturing sectors of Pakistan. It contribute nearly 1/4<sup>th</sup> of industrial value addition, provides employment to about 40% of industrial labor force, consumes more than 40% of banking credit to manufacturing sectors and accounts for 8% of GDP. The share of textiles and clothing in country's exports in the recent past ranges between 54.5 to 56%.<sup>7</sup>

Pakistan is the 4<sup>th</sup> largest producer of raw cotton in the world and 3<sup>rd</sup> largest consumer of raw cotton in the world. However, Pakistan ranks as 12<sup>th</sup> largest textiles & clothing exporter in the world exports. Its ranking in textiles ( yarns, fabrics, bed linen, towels and other textile made-ups) was 10<sup>th</sup> in the world, with

US\$ 7.37 billions exports, whereas its ranking in clothing (woven and knitted and crocheted garments) is 13<sup>th</sup> in the world.

Textile Industry made an investment of about US\$ 7.5 Billion during the last ten years (1999- 2009). The break-up of total investment indicates that 50.2 percent of investment was directed in the spinning sector followed by 17 percent in textile processing, 15 percent in weaving whereas the investment in other sectors namely knitwear, made ups and synthetic textiles were at respective rates of 7.02 percent, 4.71 percent and 5.76 percent.<sup>8</sup>

Cost competitiveness is the key determinant for world exports. Pakistan has an advantage of domestic raw material and robust spinning, weaving and processing capabilities. However, its ranking on other factors of production is mixed as compared to other regional competitors. Table No. 7 compares Pakistan, India, China, Bangladesh and Cambodia on six cost indicators: labor cost, labor hours, electricity cost, ocean transport, land transport and building. The hourly wage rate, labor hours and electricity cost are lowest in Bangladesh as compared to other four countries while Pakistan ranks third. The building cost is highest in Pakistan as compared to other four countries.

*Cotton* is the principal raw material for the textile industry supplemented by synthetic polyester staple fiber, viscose, acrylic and other fibers for final products fabrication. The industry has increased its reliance on imports of raw cotton due to slow growth of domestic raw cotton crop. Table 8 provides the information on the domestic production and imports of raw cotton during the last five years. Mills consumption of raw cotton increased from 2.1 million tons in 2004-5 to 2.5 million tons in 2008-9. Synthetic fiber consumption increased at rapid paces as compared to raw cotton as reflected by the share of synthetic fibers which increased from 19% in 2004-5 to 21% in 2008-9.

*The Spinning Sector* is the most important segment in the hierarchy of textile value chain. At present, it is comprised of 521 textile units (50 composite units and 471 spinning units) with 11.28 million spindles and 194 thousand rotors in operation (Table No. 9). All Pakistan Textile Mills Association (APTMA) claims of having over 50% of its machinery with less than seven years age, thanks to over US\$ 7 billions investment in the textiles sector during 1998-2008.

Spinning industry is facing numerous problems, which have hampered its competitiveness. Interest rates have shot up since 2004-5 to 12-15% per annum. Inflation has caused drastic price increase in the spare parts and other operational cost. Labour wages have increased almost two folds during last five years. Industry has also been hit hard by sever gas and electricity shortages since last over two years.

Cotton crop has been a central issue for cotton spinning industry. Cotton is almost 2/3<sup>rd</sup> of cotton yarn product costing. Availability of sufficient cotton crop, clean cotton, less trash contents in cotton and cotton classification/grading have been core cotton issues of the industry since last over a 15 years without much headway. Yarn production however has registered an increase despite various market related constraints since 2002-2007.

***The cloth production sector*** is very diverse in technology and economies of scale. There are three different sub-sectors in weaving i.e., Integrated, Independent Weaving Units and Power Loom Units. Pakistan's organized mills sector is reported to have over 4,000 Air Jet looms and 24,000shuttles less looms.<sup>10</sup> There

are reportedly over 300,000 power looms installed as well. Most of cloth produced by power loom is used for Processing Mills for textile made ups and local market consumption. Large capacity of used shuttle less looms is now fast replacing the power looms and enjoys a significant share in total cloth production.

Cloth produced by shuttle less and air-jet looms sector is of high quality and used in high end of products. Bulk of cloth produced by this sector is exported. Exports of fabrics have registered robust growth during last two decades. Table No 10 summarise the production of cloth and its usage by domestic market and exports. A similar trend of usage like yarns prevails in the weaving as well, as around 75% of cloth produced is processed and consumed locally.

Pakistan is fairly strong in production of sheeting quality fabrics whereas its weaving sector has not been able to develop its capability to develop similar strength in shirting fabric. Further, its production has been concentrated into basic grey fabrics without a worthwhile headway into more value added jacquard and yarn dyed fabrics for higher end of shirting market. There are about 18,000 Knitting Machines installed in this industry.<sup>11</sup>

***The Garment Industry*** provides highest value addition in textile Sector. The Industry consists of small, medium and large scale units, most of them having 50 machines and below. As per Textile Commissioner Office estimates, about 450,000 stitching machines are installed in Pakistan textiles industry.

Bulk of the ready made garments' export takes place in bottom wear category, which includes denim and other trouser product categories. But, Pakistan's share in tops is dismal due to variety of reasons. One basic factor is lack of good quality shirting manufacturing in Pakistan. Economy of scale is another important issue in marketing of shirting products to leading brands of the world. Most of garment

units are small and medium size. Such fragmented capacity does not help to inspire large buyer of shirting.

***Home textile sector*** is a major part of value chain of processing industry which has installed capacity of processing 4.6 billions square meters fabrics annually. Pakistan is among the top three exporting country for home textiles. Pakistan is the largest exporting country in the South Asian region in home textiles and other textile made ups. Pakistan exports in home textiles and other textiles made ups (including Towels) registered a growth of 33% during 2003-10.

## Section II

### Pakistan export Potential in India in Textiles:

The Indian exports in Textile and Clothing from the world stood at \$ 5.170 billion in 2010. [COMTRADE] Pakistan's exports to India stood at \$ 57.51 in 2010. Pakistan market share in India was 1.1 %. Pakistan exports are concentrated in 147 tariff lines. The Indian global importation in these 147 items stood at \$1.538. This basically means that, at the general sectoral level, Pakistan export is rather small which creates the problem of limiting complementarity. The rate of growth in these 147 lines has been rather stagnant over the years.

### Pakistan's major global textile exports and share in Indian market :

### Performance of Pakistan top 20 export items to Pakistan:

The Annexure II illustrates the above mentioned facts in detail and also gives average tariff applied by India on import of the same products from the other competitors. A more detailed analysis of the top 20 import items from these 147 items would give us an idea of the market potential and the importance or otherwise of the tariff rates.

We can see that Pakistan's exports are thinly spread out. Pakistan's top ten export to India against the tariff lines in which Pakistan has sizeable productive capacity--with its global exports worth more than \$200 million—stood at a paltry \$ 7 million and Indian imports against these items stood at only 89 million. And already our market share in these products in India is 'impressive'. So, even if 'capture' 100 % Indian market---which is otherwise unlikely---, it would bring only \$ 82 million more!

### Imports Structure of Indian Textile Sector

The top ten lines in this regard are shown in Table 13.

India imports textile items worth \$ 3.5 Billion in those tariff lines against which Pakistan is not exporting anything at all to India. These 'other' major textile import items of India are attached at Annexure III. The most striking feature of these import flows is that a total of ten lines account for \$ 1.5 billion out of the total of \$

3.5 Billion. As we can see in the Annexure II, the level of importation against most of the other tariff lines is very small. An importation of \$ 20 million plus is taking place only in 36 lines. This also means that we do not have scale except the top 36 lines here. In other words, the Indian import scene, is primarily dominated mostly by SMEs, which import these products in small volumes. And then, there are bigger companies, which 'balance' their local production with small time importation.

### **Important Features of Indian Textile import market:**

#### **Production and Export Structure:**

The principle reason for this structure is the vertical specialization which Indian textile Industry has developed over time. This is true both for the domestic use imports and for imports for exports. India imports less than five 5 of intermediate goods for its export output. [Das 2010] In most of the cases, these are special demands, which do not really promise much for Pakistan, especially when we know that all the top items are based on synthetic fibre and Pakistan is totally absent from this segment till date.

#### **Sensitive List:**

Textiles and related products alone account for 37% of its sensitive list. It may be pointed out that since India has not offered any concessions to Pakistan, the sensitive list is the largest for Pakistan. India could be expected to prune Pakistan's sensitive list provided Pakistan gives India MFN status.

There are 325 Lines in Textiles which are present on India's sensitive list for Pakistan. On the other hand, India has been offering concessions at the bilateral level [India-Sri Lanka FTA] or as an LDC [to Bangladesh] as a result of which they are enjoying steeper cuts on the tariffs applicable to them on Textiles items. If

India agrees to reduce the number of textile items in their sensitive list, it would merely be reducing the trade diverting impact of steeper cuts to Sri Lanka and Bangladesh and it would not even amount to a level playing field. That would only happen, when India and Pakistan sign a SAFTA plus arrangement. We presume this as the principle scenario that India offers Pakistan a level playing field in South Asia in Textiles. But that would amount, from Pakistan's perspective, to only the removal of an anomaly. Pakistan would need a more effective concession in exchange of MFN to India. But, Pakistan needs to identify the tariff lines on which to ask for the concessions critically, as we believe, that Pakistan would not gain much if the concessions are given on Textiles' even if textile is zero-rated. Let us hope they do not insist on reciprocity in this case as zero-rating Indian textile exports to Pakistan would be catastrophic for Pakistan's textile Industry, unless the two countries move towards deeper integration in general.

The Sensitive List under SAFTA however would not be a constraint as far as the importation is purely for exports as the export-oriented sectors in most cases procure their raw materials from the cheapest possible global sources. Even when the relevant domestic import competing sectors operate under the shield of tariffs and other support measures, exporters are allowed duty-free import of raw materials or to make use of such facilities as duty-drawback and bonded warehouse to protect their competitiveness by getting inputs from globally efficient suppliers. From this perspective, the Sensitive List maintained by different countries in the region should not be a problem for allowing their exporters to source raw materials regionally. This is an issue that deserves attention of policymakers and businesses.

### **Linkage between informal trade estimation and export potential:**

There is a 'popular' belief that substantial trade between India and Pakistan takes place as informal trade which creates the impression of a strong demand in India of

Pakistani products. The actual volume of informal trade is however unknown. Most of it is a 'guess work based on weak arbitrary methodologies. The 'estimates' vary between US\$250 mn to US\$2bn annually (Taneja 2004). Sustainable Development Policy Institute (SDPI 2005), Pakistan, estimated the informal trade between the two countries at US\$545mn.

Total informal exports from Pakistan to India are estimated to be around US\$10.5mn. The usual items exported informally from Pakistan are textiles (cloth, bed sheets and prayer mats comprise 90 percent of informal trade) and agricultural products. The informal import flows can be indicative of export potential for India in Pakistan as the latter maintains a 'positive list' India. But in case of informal exports from Pakistan to India, the volumes may indicate the sensitivity to tariff and non-tariff barriers. But having said this, the volumes---even if we add this whole amount to the existing \$ 56 Million---, the total expected volumes still remain very tiny and hardly make 1.2 % of total Indian import of textiles.

### **Section III:**

#### **Intra-industry trade:**

Pakistan can export textile items either for the local consumption or for the export market. The potential in the second case could be significant as India is a large player in T & C exports at the global level. A better understanding of the existing dynamics of the intra-industry trade between India and Pakistan can help us better grasp the ground realities and assess the prospects for Pakistan's exports and for developing regional supply chains.

The benefits of regional cooperation in textiles and clothing have been discussed by ADB - UNCTAD (2008), Robbani (2004) and Tiwari (2008). ADB-UNCTAD Study explains the growing intra-industry trade (IIT) in textiles and clothing sector within South Asia and the potential to increase it further. The study estimates bilateral Grubel Lloyd index for year 1991 and 2004 and finds that IIT increased for some of the sectors within textiles and clothing sector. These are spinning, weaving and finished textiles; knitting mills and other manufactured items of textiles. The focus of this Study is more on predicting the future potential of regional textile supply chains.

There are at least three different ways of analyzing potential supply chains. First, they can be considered as the number of times a country participates in different production stages: as an exporter of final products, exporter/importer of Stage I inputs, and exporter/importer of primary inputs in the supply chains formed. The number of stages in all supply chains in which each of the four major countries in South Asia participates is reported in column 1 of Table No. 14. Second, supply chains can be examined by tracking the flow of inputs leading to the export products. Under this perspective each supply chain represents a unique product-

country combination for export of the final product, import of Stage I inputs relevant to production of the final product and import of primary inputs relevant to the production of the Stage I inputs used. Column 2 of Table 14 reports the number of supply chains that can be formed in the region from exports of final product from each country.

And, thirdly, supply chains could also constitute the number of unique six-digit HS tariff lines involved in the participation of a particular country in different production stages as an importer of Stage I inputs needed for producing the final products and primary inputs used in the production of Stage I inputs. Column 3 of Table 14 reports the number of unique tariff lines each country can import from the region in the potential supply chains. In addition to the above described three different ways of analyzing the potential supply chains Table 14 also reports the number of unique final products which a country can export (column 4); inputs that may be imported as Stage I inputs from the region (column 5); and number of unique primary inputs that a country may import for production of Stage I inputs (column 6).

Following the first criterion given above, India participates in maximum number of stages (1032) in the identified supply chains followed by Pakistan (795), Bangladesh (245) and Sri Lanka (418). From this perspective, the more diverse the range of inputs exported/imported by a country the higher will be its participation in different stages of the supply chains. In terms of the second criterion, the final

product identified for global exports forms 109 supply chains in Bangladesh, 212 in India, 67 in Pakistan and 363 in Sri Lanka. **The unusually low figure for Pakistan is attributable to the fact that the final products exported by Pakistan are more of textile-related items than clothing. Textiles, as compared to clothing, have lower backward linkages in terms of inputs used for production of final products.** Finally, when considered the number of unique tariff lines that can be imported by a country in the identified potential supply chains, Bangladesh is found to have 65 Stage I primary inputs. The corresponding figures for India, Pakistan and Sri Lanka are respectively, 38, 36 and 117.

For Bangladesh, 15 unique tariff lines have been identified as final products for global exports that can be manufactured using regional supply chains alone. The comparable numbers for India turns out to be 37, for Pakistan 29 and for Sri Lanka 8. The unique first stage inputs identified, which can be sourced within the region, are the highest for Sri Lanka (34) closely followed by Pakistan (27) India (25) and Bangladesh (19). The number of potential primary inputs that are used in the first stage inputs can be imported are maximum for Pakistan (103) followed by India (19) and Bangladesh (47). **This basically means that Pakistan could and should source more from within the South Asia read India. Whereas, India would have the least likelihood of sourcing from within the South Asian region. This basically means that when the trade is normalized between the two countries, India would export more to Pakistan than it would import in case of Textile sector.**

The Table No. 15 presents country-wise global and regional imports of the tariff lines identified as stage I inputs or primary inputs in the potential supply chains. It may be noted that all the four countries are mainly sourcing their imports outside

the region. In other words, although regional supply capacity exists, but it is not happening.

The data in the Table however indicates that **if regional supply chains in Textiles develop, India would benefit from it the most in the short run at least. The existing regional imports of the inputs compared to total import demand are found to be very low in case of India. In the case of Bangladesh and Sri Lanka**

**the regional imports are around 30%.** India's regional imports are the lowest at less than 5%.

### **Country-specific product lines for potential supply chains:**

ADB-UNCTAD study also identifies country-specific potential supply chains with respect to exports of final output, import of Stage I and primary inputs. It includes the details of three-stage supply chains of the countries involved along with their demand inputs vis-à-vis regional supply side capacity.

In the case of India, 38 tariff lines are identified as final products for exports in the potential supply chain, out of which in 36 products it has more than 10% tariffs. 12 out of 38 products are listed as India's sensitive products under SAFTA. A comparison of India's sourcing of identified inputs from within and outside the region shows that in most of the cases its global imports are much higher. 7 out of 25 Stage I inputs, India's global imports are less than the region's global exports, which indicates the **insufficient supply capacity of the region to fulfill India's demand**. But, in 21 out of 25 products, India's regional imports are less than 10% of its total global imports. This indicates the potential of forming regional supply chains by India.

At the three-stage level, there are 67 supply chains for Pakistan. There are 27 Stage I inputs identified, of which 23 have less than 10% imports from the region. In 72 out of 103 identified primary inputs, Pakistan's regional imports are less than 10%, while in only 14 products Pakistan's global imports are more than region's global exports indicating insufficient capacity. Out of 117 unique products identified for regional imports by Pakistan, in 21 products the tariffs are above 10%. 17 products are in Pakistan's Sensitive List under SAFTA.

**The most important aspect however is to assess whether the intra-regional supplies would be competitive enough to provide justification for regional sourcing.** The fact that in many cases South Asian countries were actually exporting Stage I and primary inputs to the rest of the world seems to suggest their being globally competitive. A comparative assessment of unit value prices of the products supplied by South Asian countries vis-à-vis other leading global suppliers also reveal that in many of the items the former may actually be lower-cost suppliers. **In other words, it is in Textiles, not in clothing that a country like Pakistan could be competitive in South Asia. But the benefits of exporting stage I products is rather limited.**

The supply chain analysis conducted by ADB-UNCTAD study hints that the **opening up of Pakistan's textile industry to India could seriously undermine Pakistan's efforts in developing its own domestic backward linkage industries.** On the contrary, in case of India, it is sourcing all its import requirements from its internal backward linked industries. In all likelihood, India would not be interested, nor is there much scope for developing regional supply chains in the short term at least.

## **Section IV:**

### **Summary of Findings and suggestions:**

1. Pakistan's export potential as the things stand today is minimal in textiles in Indian market primarily because of high vertical specialization in Textiles in India.
2. Considering the following facts
  - high cotton production in Pakistan and India and low local prices
  - global demand contraction of textiles

India is highly likely to initiate ADs against Pakistan if Pakistan starts exporting significant volumes. The recent evidence suggests that India acts in haste during global demand contraction while imposing Anti Dumping and Safeguard Measures. [Brown 2011]. In Pakistan, we hear a lot about the traditional NTB's imposed by India such and visa policy, regulations, standards etc. Indians use ADs as an equally, perhaps more, potent tool to restrict imports at will. There are solutions available to reduce/slow down the onset of remedial measures and Pakistan need to put it on the negotiation table. We can insist on prior consultation and joint investigation before any AD investigation.

On the other hand, Pakistan needs to quickly understand the extensive 'government support/subsidy' system of India which is going to turn out to be a greater threat than NTB's for Pakistan's export prospects.

3. By 2016, the maximum tariff rates would fall to 5 % for non-LDCs countries in SAFTA. This basically means a fast erosion of preferences for Pakistan, if we get it in 2012. [LDC are already zero rated in SAFTA by India or as a result of bilaterals] In other words, there is too little time for trade re-orientation at the disposal of Pakistan to benefit from lower tariff rates.
4. Sensitive list: A steep reduction in the size of sensitive list of India for Pakistan has to be a major item on the agenda, where we need to avoid reciprocity also.
5. Exaggerated claims of future volumes of trade between India and Pakistan:  
  
The latest reports put the expected volume of trade between the two countries in a few years time at \$ 10 Billion. This is totally fictional.
6. Most of the rosy predictions hinge at the factors such as cheap labour in Pakistan and depreciating currency. Whether these two factors can attract Indian investment in RMG in Pakistan leading to the emergence of regional Joint Ventures? Not in sight.
7. Pakistan, in case of textiles can export to two segments:
  - Pakistan exports act as inputs to Indian export sectors
  - Pakistan exports for the Indian market

In the first case, there is a very limited opportunity as India is big on vertical specialization in textiles i.e., the share of all intermediate imports of Indian textiles in its export output.

As far as the second segment is concerned i.e., exporting finished goods for the Indian market [RMG and Home Textiles] the Indian import base is very small.

8. Cost Issues: Costs are the proxy for export competitiveness. Though we do not systematically monitor the whole sale and retail prices of different textile items of India and Pakistan, the general impression is that India is more competitive. The initial cost advantage due to depreciation of Pak Ruppee is also neutralized over time by cost push inflation in Pakistan.
9. Need of future analyses: The export performance of the countries is not mechanically reproduced. So, it would always be hard to guess it correctly. Most of the time, it remains an indicative guess. The internal as well as external dynamics keep on changing. In case of Indian textile imports, we have not witnessed an unusual upheaval and we can predict with a measure of confidence that the pattern could continue for a few more years. But that is not the case with overall import scene of India. [Indian textile imports only accounted for 2 % of their total imports during 2010-2011.] There is a need that the Ministry of Commerce develop an analytical focus on India import market. We need to have India specialists who are able to critically analyze and evaluate the foreign exchange fluctuations, labour costs, increased sophistication of the local market, sectoral export performance trends etc. Our Ministry should be able to identify the critical elements, which would/might play a role in the coming years and run simulations to fine tune its policy interventions. In this regard, the capacity to critically evaluate the findings of the studies produced by other stakeholders would be very important. [Our media is quoting the results of an Indian government study un-critically. This Report presents a very rosy picture. Dawn 240911]

10. View from Indian side regarding textile sector: ‘‘Textile is the only industry in India that is self-sufficient and complete in cotton value chain- producing everything from fibres to the highest value added finished product of garments. Its growth and vitality therefore has critical bearings on the Indian economy at large.’

**11. Low appetite for importation from Pakistan:**

Due to adverse mentioning of Pakistan in mainstream Indian media, overall low levels of appetite to import from Pakistan act as an additional negative factors, which needs to be quantified and given due importance.

**12.** We must not forget that India has already given Pakistan MFN status and Pakistan is enjoying the duty concessions under SAFTA. But Pakistan’s exports nonetheless have not picked up. Despite the fact that the ‘pundits’ have been advising since so long that Pakistan ‘must’ benefit from the Indian growth etc.

**13.** Need to remember, T & C in India is a robust dynamic sector. It is not a struggling sector. Finding a niche in it would be doubly hard.

**14. Creating the export capacity to meet the export demand in India:** Due to a variety of reasons---stagnant or falling labour productivity, energy supplies, excessive reliance on cotton, continued low base of synthetic fibres---Pakistan export capacity in Home Textiles and RMG would remain limited. If Pakistan does not expand and diversify its production and export base and starts exporting these items with the help of new efficient investments and governmental support, its gains from added preferences in India would be short lived.

Pakistan industry till date is not sufficiently equipped to handle incremental high volume orders from large buyers. If Pakistan has to make its Textile sector as the major export champion for exporting to India and for that matter to China, we need to invest to reduce the unit costs.<sup>13</sup>

**15.** We need to understand the nature of demand in Indian market and make a five year plan to increase our exports to India by this or that percentage.

**16. ROO would also matter.** Pakistan can import synthetic fibre as well as long staple and export the fabrics to India provided the Rules of Origin are not very stringent. EU recently eased its ROO under GSP, which should be a good guide for us.

**17. Need of integrating supply-side and demand side trade policies:** One of the important measures in this respect is to lower duty on polyester and viscose to help our millers reduce dependency on cotton. In Pakistan the ratio of synthetic to cotton is an abysmal 7 % as compared to the global average of and Indian ratio of 47 %. We also need to address the labour productivity and cost of capital issues.

**18. Need to match the incentive structure.** The competitive markets exist more so in books and on paper. As long as our competitors in India such as Bangladesh and the Indian local competitors are supported by trade distorting subsidies by their respective governments, Pakistan would be obliged to match these incentives to some extent, in some measure. Bangladesh gives cash incentives to its textile sector heavily. Its subsidy expenditure---most of it is on Textiles---stands at 7 % plus of the annual budget. Recently, Bangladesh has converted their overdue loans into term loans. The Indian government also gives different kind of subsidies to its local producers with

whom Pakistan has to compete for the local Indian demand. **It is not only NTBs that India needs to remove.** If Pakistan gives MFN status to India, it should legitimately expect that India gives the ‘real’ MFN to Pakistani textile exporting firms. It would not only mean the removal of NTB--- general as well as Pakistan specific---it would be required to reduce the support of different kinds it gives to its local producers. India is very heavy on such support. A genuine trade liberalization and integration between India and Pakistan must take care of this aspect. In fact, it is expected that --- given the important role played by the Indian textiles sector in the Indian economy and the lobbying power of the textile industry, the Indian government would sweeten the deal with Pakistan by increasing the support to local Indian industry. There is an urgent need to understand the nature and quantum of support provided by the Indian Union governments and the State government to Indian textile sector, across the whole of the supply chain.

#### **19. Understanding the nature of local demand of Textiles and Clothing in**

**India:** The salient features of Indian local demand---i.e., the factors which make it different---are the bulge in demands with festive seasons,<sup>14</sup> popularity of mixed fabric, dynamics of sub-regional markets etc. [For example, we need to understand Surat phenomenon better. Surat is the biggest hub of manmade fibre textiles in India, having 55,000 textile traders spread over 140 textile markets in the city with the average sales of the Surat textile market is around IRs 1 billion per day during normal times and around IRs 1.25 billion per day during the festive season.]

**20. Need to reduce the excessive concentration in the low value added segment of the T&C:** Pakistan's gains would be minimal if we export more of cotton, yarn and fabric to India. There is need to invest more ---both by the private sector and the government--- to address this structural problem quickly.

**21. Textile First Policy:**

Instead of offering MFN to India in general, Pakistan should offer India to develop a Textile Vision for SAARC with an aim to develop South Asia as a Textile and Apparel Hub. South Asia produces more than one third of the global cotton production yet more of the inputs in national textile sectors come from out of the region. The countries in South Asia can in principle form a major textile and apparel hub, provided they can work together to overcome the mutual mistrust and trade barriers against each other. After interacting with the business leaders in textiles, one feels that that there was a serious vision deficit to find innovative imaginative solutions for regionalisation of supply chain in textile and clothing sector. Though SAFTA members have increased the importation of raw materials and intermediate goods from each other in the SAARC region in the recent past, the scope of trading and cooperation can be enlarged in many other areas too such as research, bio technology, training, exchange of human resource etc. It is being expected that the inclusion of services and investment in SAFTA would enhance the business opportunities in general. But this could contribute most importantly in the realization of a great potential in the textile sector. We believe, it is not the MFN by Pakistan to India, which is going to give the much-needed impetus to the maximalist visions of the SAFTA process. SAARC countries, along with the ongoing efforts at

expanding the scope of the SAFTA process and addressing the constraints and issues in the domain of trade facilitation, need to undertake a big effort in order to make South Asia the textile and apparel hub. They need to commit to a South Asian Textile Vision 2025 in the form of a separate agreement, focusing on regional cooperation in trade, investment, technology transfer, removal of Textile specific NTBs [Annexure III], and research as a pilot/ 'early harvest' agreement. This would also help Pakistan devise effective stabilization and adjustment policies to cope with the possible negative impact of liberalizing trade with India. Pakistan should first sign a "Pakistan-India Trade and Investment Agreement in Textile" sector instead of giving MFN to India or a bilateral FTA between India and Pakistan. Both countries could possibly establish a fund to promote JVs in Textiles for exporting to third countries. Textile, in fact, is the 'strategy paradox' for South Asians. It is in textiles that SAFTA would rise or fall. Making textile a champion sector could bring in Maldives and Nepal also in the fast track development as well as Afghanistan eventually. Textiles can in fact lead the process of faster but controlled economic integration between India and Pakistan/SAARC and needs to be dealt separately.
